TEACHER WORKSHOP: LIVING ON THE EDGE #1005

October 15-18, in Gardiner, MT \$335 (meals and lodging not included)

Teachers -- dare to visit a super volcano! Explore one of the most geologically dynamic places on earth in search of forces shaping Yellowstone National Park and the planet on a grand scale. Using observation, measurement, simulation, modeling, and research, you'll learn about magma and hot spots, future volcanic activity, geyser basin systems including microbial ecology, hydrothermal activity, and other geologic forces. Learn interdisciplinary techniques that will excite your students in the classroom and field. Activities are correlated to Wyoming, Montana and Idaho education standards. Copies of all instructional materials demonstrated during the workshop are provided.
